**Note:** If Entries are such that there is an insufficient number of dogs entered in the minor stakes, the Temiskaming Retriever Club may exercise its option to run both stakes together. This will be determined after the draw. Any dogs entered in both stakes will have their entry fee refunded accordingly.

**Headquarters:** "The Bear Camp" on Hwy # 11 east of Kapuskasing

**Prizes:** Standard C.K.C. rosettes will be presented for all placings and recipients of Certificate of Merit in each stake.

**Game:** Dead Ducks and / or Pheasants may be used in all stakes

**Running Order:** will rotate in the Open & Amateur stakes. Judges will have the option of implementing a system of rotation in the minor stakes. Starting number in the All-age stakes will be based on the two digits right of the decimal on the prior Wednesday TSX closing.

**Non CKC members** who are Canadian, running a wholly-owned dog, cannot win a placement unless they pay a non-member fee to the CKC. Otherwise, Awards and Titles will be cancelled. The fee will be paid directly to the CKC.

**Payment:** Make cheques payable to the Temiskaming Retriever Club, dated no later than August 1st 2019. A listing fee of \$11.30 must accompany the entry form of any dog for which an individual CKC registration or ERN number is not shown. **Separate entry forms must be completed for each stake the dog is entered.**

**NRCC Fee:** Effective 2018, the NRCC has undertaken a proactive role to ensure future funding for National events. The NRCC is asking member clubs to collect \$5.00 per dog competing in each All Age Stake held. Fees collected will be submitted to the NRCC Treasurer. At the end of the trial season, 100% of the funds collected will be distributed retroactively to the Host Club (s) for that year. Please note: The \$5.00 fee is included in your entry fee of \$85.00

**Scratches/refunds** of dogs withdrawn after the draw for reasons other than stated in the CKC Retriever Field Trial rule book will not have their entry fees refunded. **Please submit all fees in Canadian funds; no exchange will be given on U.S. funds.**

**ENTRIES CLOSE** Sunday August 4<sup>th</sup> 2019 8:00 PM Entries received after this date and time may be rejected. Excerpt from CKC Retriever Field Trial rules and regulations, dated 1 January 2011, 21.7 P 67 "It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred"

Regulation 23.2: >Any person who abuses a dog on the grounds or premises of a trial, or who otherwise conduct themselves in a manner prejudicial to the best interest of the field trial, are subject to disciplinary action by the Discipline Committee

Did you know..... Kapuskasing means "Bend in the River" in the Cree language.....

Like most northern communities, Kapuskasing began with the development of the [National Transcontinental Railway](#). The Canadian Government built this railroad to connect our country from east to west. The MacPherson station (known as Kapuskasing starting in 1917) was simply a water stop until the establishment of the MacPherson/Kapuskasing World War I Internment Camp.

During World War I, the Canadian government worried about enemy aliens residing within the country; their solution was to create internment camps across the country. The Government decided that, coupled with their wish to create an Experimental Farm in Northern Ontario, MacPherson's remoteness was ideal. The internees were isolated and could work to clear the land for the Experimental Farm. A small cemetery about 2 km west of the community is the only remnant of the internment camp, except for an extensive collection of photographs at the Ron Morel Memorial Museum.
